4. Sam Manson Air Monitoring

- Air Monitor has been set up in East End of Hamilton just East of Red Hill Valley Parkway in Sam Manson Park
- Measuring PM2.5, Ozone, NOX, SO2 and metrological conditions
- Operational on Jan 1, 2013 and live data on HAMN website
- First City owned monitor in network
- Pilot program for one year
- As project move forward wish to have input from Clean Air Hamilton on data analysis
- Compare MOE West and downtown air monitor to East End monitor
- Open House for community to learn about air monitor is on Jan 16, 2013
- Media releases sent
- City website <u>www.hamilton.ca/airmonitor</u> set up on monitor
- Interest in AQHI posting similar to Halton

5. Air Quality Task Force

- Report to Hamilton Board of Health in November 2012
- Discussed at last meeting
- Task Force/working group under Clean Air Hamilton
- Matt provided a draft proposal of the group (mandate, scope,time-lines)
- Time-line not mandated yet but propose a year

- Interest in what actions can be taken at a local level (municipal level)
- What powers do we have as a City to address?
- Not a health study
- Not reviewing other levels of government legislation and policy
- This may change due to regional airshed proposal
- Chair of group be a member of Clean Air Hamilton
- Outcome a final report and presentation to Board of Health from Clean Air Hamilton
- Could look at proposed airshed model and other tools
- Actions to improve local surveillance of air quality
