3. Welcoming our new Clean Air Hamilton Chair Dr. Bruce Newbold – Denis Corr (5 minutes)

4. The Atmospheric Fund (TAF) Focus Group Update – Denis Corr (10 minutes)

- Denis C. and Michael G invited to TAF workshop.
- Kevin Behan is Hamilton rep for TAF funding.
- TAF granting funding of \$14 million for projects.
- Outreach or research ideas can be submitted for funding.
- Michael G. They wanted to identify priorities that make the greatest impact; they were seeking direction, increase communication outside of Toronto,
- Denis C. recommends having TAF attend a meeting
- ACTION: Trevor I. will invite TAF to a future CAH meeting
- Brian M. City has been advising community groups to approach TAF,
- \$14 million funding is intended for climate change work, due to overlap, that funding should apply to many air quality initiatives.

5. CCME Air Quality Report and Website – Trevor Imhoff (10 minutes)

6. The Ontario Lung Association Programs and Research – Tristan McIntosh (10 minutes)

- Indoor and outdoor air quality is a focus. Indoor is mostly on Radon, they are doing education and awareness, Take Action on Radon Group, work with Mike Holmes and his son's group. They focus on air quality issues including VOC's, pet dander and others.
- They offer a Lung Health Line, indoor and outdoor, asthma.
- Focus on AQHI for outdoor, partnering with York Region, with involvement from Health Canada, if successful with York, they plan to move to other regions.
- Healthy Home, website focuses on air quality in and out of the home, successful in the past.
- They provide printed air quality literature.
- The Ontario Lung Association offers a wood burning, open air burning initiative and does advocacy work.
- Working to include respiratory health into the building code amendments.
- Trevor I asks for expansion on details of Healthy Intake Line.

- People calling the Healthy Intake Line speak to certified respiratory educators;
 residents can call about lung cancer, asthma, pollen or other questions.
- Trevor I- this would be an added service that PHS could refer Air Quality complaints to, worth looking into.
- Tristan M- states that they have good social media presence, says if CHA members have new initiatives, their people can shoot it out for promotion,
- Sally R- asks about partnerships with the COPD clinics locally.
- Tristin M- says they do partner with COPD groups, and they have a great deal of partnerships, they are also partnered with COPD with Hamilton, Firestone clinic, Asthma clinic.
- Denis C asks if Green Venture and Environment Hamilton are teamed up with the Lung association, Lynda L says Environment Hamilton could be more, Michael G says Green Venture is not. Susan Chapman says that their groups should collaborate.

7. MOECC SO₂ and Cumulative Effects EBR Briefing Update – Trevor Imhoff (10 minutes)

- Denis C introduced, major initiative with SO₂ and Collaborative effects, they made presentation last Thursday.
- New limits were released the day of the meeting.
- Trevor I. was approached by MOECC toxicologists, they want to have Members contact them prior to submitting comments for anything for SO₂ or Benzene or Benzo(a)pyrene related.
- Presentation not public yet, Trevor I. will distribute when finalized to group for review, not for wide distribution, keep within CAH.
- Denis C. says that lots of work has been done with updating the SO₂ standard. Lots of toxicology, federal government has been working hard on it. Cumulative effects part is a big deal, means that companies have to meet ambient air quality that takes into consideration of what's there already.
- They've been focusing on Benzene and Benzo(a)pyrene. Lynda L. chairs group for determining cumulative effects.
- Lynda L. says that her understanding is that this dates back to Lafarge case (early 2000's), hearing officer from MOECC identified that cumulative effects must be taken into consideration. This proposal is focused in benzene and benzo(a)pyrene, and is built on cumulative effects.
- Denis C. says this has been going on with the MOECC etc. for a long time.
- James K. says that SO₂ is still pretty high for hourly standard.
- Denis C.- says that previous standards were set based on what was practical for what people could achieve instead of health impacts.
- Trevor I. suggests group discussion, wants to reiterate that standards are based on health and environment impacts, not technology or economic issues,
- Trevor I. shared human health studies slides, (page 8 of presentation), proposed standards (page 9)
- ACTION Trevor I. will send out EBR number to group.
- The group has 45 days to respond.

- Denis C. Transitional Operating Conditions (page 20) When starting up, short term etc. there can be more emissions, the limit applies for these cases as well.
- Lynda L. says that she's shocked that the proposal doesn't apply to Northern Ontario, this is problematic. Thinks we should be applying same standards across the province.
- Proposal is for proposed or expanding facilities. Existing facilities will be regulated by site specific standards.
- Sally R. says that we need to get our EBR comments together for review.
- Trevor I. shows map of Hamilton/Burlington with all the Action levels (1, 2 and 3) slide 7
