2. Land Acknowledgement

The City of Hamilton is situated upon the traditional territories of the Erie, Neutral, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Mississaugas. This land is covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, which was an agreement between the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabek to share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. We further acknowledge that this land is covered by the Between the Lakes Purchase, 1792, between the Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Today, the City of Hamilton is home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we recognize that we must do more to learn about the rich history of this land so that we can better understand our roles as residents, neighbours, partners and caretakers (source).

4. Extreme Heat Working Group (15 minutes), Andrea McDowell

- Part of Climate Change Adaptation Planning Project
- Pilot project on implementation in the community
- Public workshops have shown common concern for heat in community
- Partnered with City Housing and Community Partners
- Funded by ICLEI Canada through Advancing Adaptation Project
- Selected four buildings, about 900 units
- Conducted Research and literature review, survey and will hold workshops later this month
- Pilot interventions based on survey results

Discussion

- Warmer temperatures impact Air Quality measures from the project minimize exposure, probably have co-benefit of lowering exposure to poor air quality
- A student at McMaster looked at impacts of messaging around extreme heat, importance and messaging
- Green Venture did inventory of Trees across the City, planted trees, continuing this spring. May be an opportunity to collaborate
